Some residents have expressed an interest in illuminating the BALBOA PENINSULA POINT sign at the G Street traffic island. This would aid in way-finding and evening traffic slowing as drivers unfamiliar with the area search for addresses. The **Community Foundation of Balboa Peninsula Point** (The Foundation) initiated conversations with the City and received general agreement that such a project is feasible. Power is available for the project via an existing underground conduit, but wires must be drawn over 90 feet from the source. According to Ken Drellishak, The Foundation President, "We obtained a contractor quote to do the job and the City is obtaining another contractor quote for comparison. When all quotes are available, we will make a selection and proceed with the necessary Encroachment Permit and City approvals. We hope to be able to complete the job before year end."

Effective August 12, 2019

On June 11, 2019, the City Council adopted <u>Ordinance No. 2019-9</u> restricting constructionrelated noise on Saturday in the designated <u>High-Density Areas</u>; as well as requiring a project information sign for new construction and substantial remodels.

The <u>High-Density Area map</u> identifies the following: Balboa Island, Balboa Peninsula, Bay Island, Bay Shores, Collins Island, Corona Del Mar Village, Harbor Island, Linda Isle, Lido Isle, West Newport and Newport Shores <u>(Exhibit A of Ordinance No. 2019-9).</u>

The ordinance does not prevent a homeowner or any individual from performing maintenance work on their property as long as it is done in a manner that limits disturbance from noise and remains in compliance with the Newport Beach Municipal Code (NBMC).

Homeowners and contractors have until **August 12, 2019** (effective date) to make arrangements under their current contractual agreements to comply with the NBMC ordinance. Violations of the City ordinance will be subject to code enforcement actions and citations pursuant to the provisions of <u>NBMC § 10.28.040</u> and <u>NBMC § 1.04.10</u>.

- <u>Temporary Project Information Sign Specifications</u> when a property in a designated high-density area is required to be fenced in accordance with Section <u>15.60.020</u>, a temporary project information sign shall be affixed to the fence that can be readily viewed by the public.
