**Easter Egg Hunt** - The L Street Park 35th Annual Easter Egg Hunt for our younger generations was another success. The Bruce Asper family with five other families started our tradition. From six families to now well over a couple hundred plus families, this is a great cultural family continuity story. Thanks to all who participated in making this such a successful event and, especially board members Lisa Jabara and Julee Johnson, who spent many hours organizing this year's event.

Traffic/Speed - Your Board has continued to work to maintain the safety of our residential community. Larry Lerner, a board member serving as Community Liaison - Police and Traffic has been a volunteer for many years associated with the Newport Beach Police Department as a VIP (Volunteer In Policing). It was through his continued persistence that last month additional "25 mile speed limit" signs were posted at the entrance of our residential community. Further, I am sure you noticed the excellent placement of the "speed trailer" (monitor) at Balboa Blvd. and G Street (right in front of The monitor was in operation from March 16th through our signage). March 23rd, and the results were very interesting statistics to read. Five thousand eight hundred and three vehicles were recorded on average per day or a sum of 40,625 for the week with an average speed of 24.96 MPH (based on the grand total). The minimum speed recorded was 10 MPH and the maximum was 53 MPH. Very Interesting and surprising as to the vehicular count
